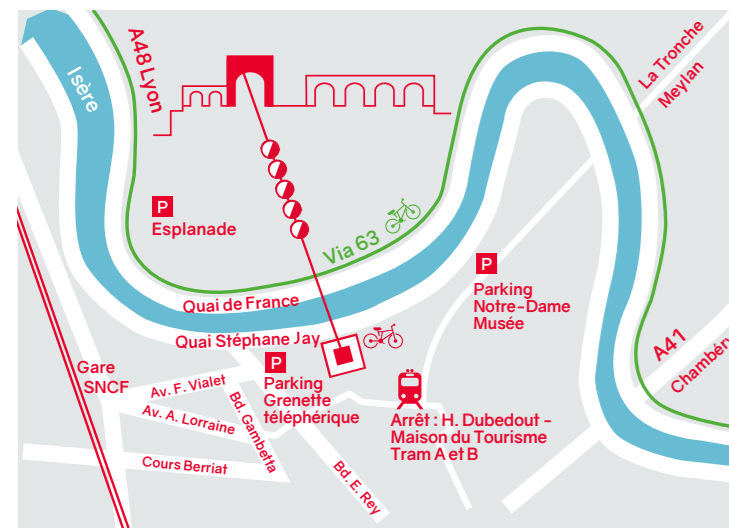

EXPLORE...



As a first step into the Chartreuse mountain range and the starting point of a number of paths, the Bastille attracts many sports men and women, as well as residents of Grenoble looking for family walks.

While walking, discover the unique and preserved biodiversity of the site, while enjoying exceptional views of the city and the surrounding Alpine ranges.

Short circular walks

Recommended:

- Discover the paths and the fortification in a short time.
- If you have purchased a round trip cable car ticket.
- To visit the Memorial to the French Mountain Troops.

Starting point: Place Tournadre - Fort de la Bastille.

Promenade de la Poudrière (Powder Magazine Walk):

30 mins. loop - 50m of ascent/descent. Accessible for all.

The Mandrin Caves:

30 mins. loop - 30m of ascent/descent. Underground passages and stairs, including more than 260 steps!

Mont Jalla, National Memorial to the French Mountain Troops:

60 mins. - 140 metres of ascent/descent - Path. Panoramic view at 360°.

From the banks of the Isère to the Bastille

Recommended:

- To walk up to the Bastille Fort.
- To walk back down to Grenoble.
- To discover the vegetation and fortifications.

Starting point:

From the top: Place Tournadre - Fort de la Bastille.

From the bottom: Jardin des Dauphins, Place de la Cymaise, Place Saint Laurent.

The Bastille on the Saint-Laurent side:

Between 30 and 45 mins. down - Between 45 mins. and 1 hr. 15 mins. up 300m of ascent/descent - Paths and steps. Follow "Porte Saint-Laurent".

The Bastille on the Porte de France side:

Between 20 and 40 mins. down - Between 40 mins. and 1 hr. up 300m of ascent/descent - Paths and steps. Follow "Porte de France".

Higher up towards the Chartreuse

Recommended:

- For experienced and well-equipped walkers.
- To enjoy a hike over a half day or several days.

Starting point:

Jardin des Dauphins, Place de la Cymaise, Place Saint Laurent or Fort de la Bastille.

Southern gateway to the Chartreuse Natural Park:

Several hikes to Saint-Martin-le-Vinoux, La Tronche or Mont Rachais.

Orienteering courses and trails

A permanent orienteering course including four routes is available around the Bastille and its cable car. Maps can be obtained free of charge from the reception of the Régie du Téléphérique (cable car operator) or from the Maison de la Montagne.

Three trail-running routes start from the Porte Saint Laurent offering various levels of difficulty: easy, medium and hard. Maps can be downloaded online from our website.

Bastille via ferrata

The Bastille via ferrata overlooks the Porte de France. It is one of the rare routes to be found in an urban environment. Two sections of 200m and 300m ranging from quite difficult to very difficult are possible.

To be undertaken unaccompanied.

Note that the "Jardin des Dauphins" gate is open from 9am - 8pm from 07/04 to 15/09 and from 9am - 6pm from 16/09 to 31/03. Follow signs for "Fontaine au Lion".

A preserved natural area and a veritable "bubble of fresh air" above the city.

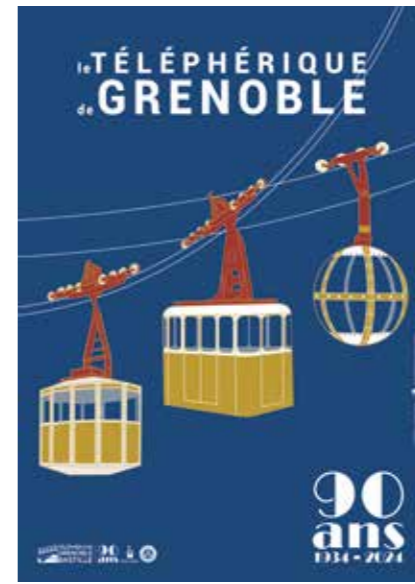
Despite being situated close to the 45th parallel north, the Bastille benefits from a Mediterranean-type mesoclimate thanks to the diversity of its environment and its fully south-facing slopes. Because of its "South of France" feel, many Alpine and Mediterranean species flourish here.

The site is recognised as a reservoir of biodiversity by the regional economic coherence scheme (SRCE) and the territorial coherence scheme (SCOT) and is classed as a National Zone of Ecological Interest for Fauna and Flora (ZNIEFF).

The Grenoble cable car – An epic journey

Treat yourself to spectacular views!
An unforgettable journey on one of the first urban cable cars in the world, after Rio de Janeiro and Cape Town.
From Grenoble city centre, it provides quick access to the Bastille: a fortified site that has since become an unmissable tourist attraction.
The cable car was inaugurated in 1934 and fully renovated in 1976. Since then, the "Bubbles" have become the symbol of Grenoble.



One of the first urban cable cars in the world!

1934 » 1951 » 1959 » 1976 » Since 2005

- Operating system: reversible.
- Two dodecagonal wooden cabins (twelve sides).
- Capacity: 15 passengers + 1 operator.
- Two new rectangular metal cabins.
- Capacity: up to 21 passengers + 1 operator.
- Addition of a waiting room for 100 passengers at the lower station.
- New system: continuous, circulating movement.
- New lower station.
- Automated controls.
- New cabins: the famous plexiglass and aluminium "Bubbles".
- Capacity: 2 sets of 4 or 5 cabins carrying 6 passengers each.
- 2005: accessibility works: renovation of the upper station.
- 2009: redevelopment of the lower station.
- 2016: replacement of ticket machines by new generation equipment.

Discover the open-air exhibition about the history of the cable car on the summit of the Bastille.

348 000 passengers per year.
263 metres of ascent (altitude of the upper station: 475 metres).
Average journey time: **6 mn.**
Speed from 0 to 6 metres per second.

The "second generation" cable car

1976

- New system: continuous, circulating movement.
- New lower station.
- Automated controls.
- New cabins: the famous plexiglass and aluminium "Bubbles".

The Bastille is a former military fortress built in the 19th century by General Haxo. Accessible in only 6 minutes by cable car, this natural promontory offers an exceptional panoramic view of the city and its surrounding mountains.
The landscape is breathtaking both in the daytime and at night, taking in the Chartreuse, the Vercors, Belledonne and even as far as Mont Blanc.
